Research

2011 **Principle Investigator**: Prevalence and burden of diseases presenting to pediatric inpatient facilities at Gondar University Hospital, Ethiopia

- Analyzed temporal and geographical trends in admission and identified predictors of mortality
- Results:
 - Statistical baseline for six quality improvement initiatives
 - o Database template reproduced for audits of HIV clinic and neonatology ward
 - Manuscript submitted for publication in *Journal of Tropical Pediatrics*

2011 **Principle Investigator**: Implementation and evaluation of an integrated pediatric mortality reduction intervention, Gondar University Hospital, Ethiopia

- Spearheaded a three-pronged intervention:
 - Generated evidence-based, institution-specific management protocols for pediatric emergencies
 - Established departmental consensus on content of management protocols
 - Provided simulation-based training to interns in protocol use
- Results:
 - 41% reduction in mortality from baseline
 - o 30% improvement in knowledge and 400% improvement in procedural skills
 - Protocols actively in use on ward, ownership transferred to local faculty
 - Generating manuscript for publication
